Item of Service (IoS): standard vaccination fee.	£12.58 per dose.	Following the administration of each dose of specified vaccine for each eligible patient for PCN Groupings, in line with the Enhanced Service Specification: COVID-19 vaccination programme 2020/21	The NHS Business Services Authority will manage the payments claims process to the lead Practice for the PCN grouping via NHAIS and Non-ISFE.
IoS: Care Homes supplement	In addition to the £12.58 per dose IoS fee, for vaccinations delivered in an older adult care home setting (residents and staff) the following supplement is paid: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • £30 for first doses administered Monday 14 December to Sunday 17 January; • £20 for first doses administered Monday 18 to Sunday 24 January; • £10 for first doses administered Monday 25 to Sunday 31 January; • £10 for first doses administered Monday 1 February 2021 onwards; • £10 for all second doses administered. 		The NHS Business Services Authority will manage the payments claims process to the lead Practice.
IoS: Housebound supplement	In addition to the £12.58 per dose IoS fee, for vaccinations delivered to housebound patients, £10 per dose.	Applies retrospectively to any first dose vaccinations that have taken place since 14 December 2020.	The NHS Business Services Authority will manage the payments claims process to the lead Practice.
IoS: Other Residential Settings supplement	In addition to the £12.58 per dose IoS fee, for vaccinations delivered to patients in other residential settings (such as care homes for people with learning disabilities or mental health problems, or hostel/hotel accommodation for the homeless, accommodations for asylum seekers or refugees, where it is not possible for these patients to attend vaccination clinics) £10 per dose.	Applies from 15 February 2021.	The NHS Business Services Authority will manage the payments claims process to the lead Practice for doses once a new event flag has been added to the Point of care system. Until then, claims will be manual (see section 2 of the PCN Finance Guidance).

Reasonable additional costs, further set-up and on-going reasonable additional costs (additional venue hire and associated costs, security, cleaning, additional oxygen supplies and additional Clinical waste, equipment not specified for central provision and not already funded via other routes).	Dependent on local need and agreement.	Immediately prior to, and during, the site's vaccine delivery.	PCN groupings should seek pre- authorisation and submit actual claims with evidence to their CCG (or Regional Team where their CCG is not delegated) within 4 weeks of the date of pre- authorisation (see section 2 of the PCN Finance Guidance).
Rebooking costs after announcement on delay of second doses.	£1,000 per PCN grouping.	This is a one-off payment following the 31 December 2020 announcement.	The lead GP practice for the PCN grouping should submit the claim to their CCG (or Regional Team where their CCG is not delegated) (see section 9 of the PCN Finance Guidance).
Additional workforce funding to support update of Pinnacle records in January 2021.	Up to £950 (including VAT) per week up to a maximum of £2500 (including VAT) per PCN grouping.	This covers additional workforce costs between 15 – 31 January 2021.	The lead GP practice for the PCN grouping should submit the claim to their CCG (or Regional Team where their CCG is not delegated) (see section 10 of the PCN Finance Guidance).
Additional PCN Clinical Director support increasing from 0.25 WTE to 1 WTE.	Funding covers an additional 0.75 WTE per PCN.	From January to March 2021, the time for which at least one Core Network Practice is signed up to the COVID-19 Vaccination Programme Enhanced Service.	PCNs will not need to submit claims for this. The payment will be made to the PCN's nominated payee for payments under the Network Contract DES.
Additional SMS costs incurred as a result of using covid-19 vaccine appointment booking systems and the increased use of SMS messaging by general practice both for the broader COVID vaccination programme and the additional flu cohorts.	Dependent on local need.	From 14 December 2020.	PCN groupings or CCG lead for GP SMS contract should submit actual claims with evidence to their CCG (or Regional Team where their CCG is not delegated) (see section 14 of the PCN Finance Guidance).
